



Derry-Londonderry is famous for the seventeenth-century city wall that surrounds the Old Town district.

The walls are the largest ancient monument in this part of the country.

Almost 6 meters high, the oval walls are about 1.6 kilometers long, complete with gates, guard towers, parapets, ramparts and enormous cannons.

During your visit, your guide shares stories of the city's past, from the first settlements of thousands of years ago to its monastic period and the series of wars that marked its

Continue the walk to the Siege Museum where you can understand everything about the famous siege of 1688, when the city heroically resisted King James II's troops for 105 days. For a dip in more recent history, it is enough to continue with the more contemporary events of Northern Ireland illustrated at the Museum of Free Derry, dedicated to the history of civil rights in the 1960s, while to the city's history and the Spanish Invincible Army and its shipwreck in Ireland the beautiful Tower Museum is dedicated, which also boasts a splendid panorama of the city and the Foyle river. Another must-see is the splendid Guildhall, Derry Londonderry's most extraordinary building: it is a neo-Gothic red brick marvel that stands in a rather picturesque square.

An important feature of the city is the presence of the murals that offer a unique point of view on that era known as The Troubles to indicate the Northern Irish conflict.

To admire the city from the water another walking tour leads to the discovery of the Peace Bridge, a vital link between the two banks of the river. Dominating the skyline is the spire of the beautiful St. Columb's Cathedral.
